



1-Kampong Phluk

Kampong Phluk means "Harbor of the Tusks". The community largely depends on fishing for survival, primarily shrimp, spending Cambodia's wet season (May-October) fishing. Many houses are constructed on stilts ranging from 6 m to 9 m to accommodate the changes in water level between the wet and dry seasons. a scenic route and see floating markets, floating schools, fishing farms, and rice paddies, Buddhist Monasteries. About 31km from Siem Reap city center.

2-Kampong Khleang

Kompong Khleang is the largest floating village in Siem Reap province. Located about 55km outside of the city, the villages are home to over 10,000 people. This is a great place to see rural Cambodian life! Wonderful to take a boat ride and see all the stilted houses and the local's fishing, floating market, restaurant, and local activities.









3-Chong Khneas

Chong Kneas is the floating village that is closest and most accessible to Siem Reap. It is a quick and easy visit to the Tonle Sap, boat tours of Chong Khneas are available, departing from the boat docks all day long for floating households and the floating markets, clinics, schools, and other boatloads of tourists.

4-Me Chrey

Me Chrey moves with the water level and is prettier during the wet season, when houses are anchored around an island pagoda. It is located to the south of Puok District, about 25km from Siem Reap. It is one of the smaller villages in the area but sees far fewer tourists than busy Chong Kneas.
